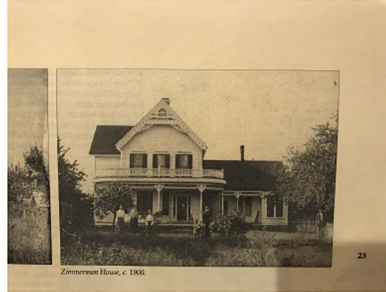

History of the Zimmerman Farm

The Zimmerman Family were dairy farmers. Jacob and Lena Zimmerman purchased the land in 1869. They lived in a log house until their home was built. Three generations of the Zimmerman family lived on this property until 1992 when their youngest daughter Isobel passed away. Isobel wanted the house and the contents to remain in the home and turned it into a museum. Isobel joined ECHO as chair member in 1987 and willed the home and its contents to ECHO.
